O R D E R

Now on this 13th day of November, 2012, comes on for consideration plaintiff's **Motion for Leave to File CM/ECF** (document #11). The Court, being well and sufficiently advised, finds and orders as follows:

1. Plaintiff Curtis Neeley, acting pro se, filed this action on September 17, 2012, alleging various privacy violations by the Federal Communications Commission, Microsoft Corporation, and Google, Inc.

2. On November 9, 2012, Mr. Neeley filed the present motion seeking leave from the Court to register as a CM/ECF user and to file future motions and pleadings electronically. Mr. Neeley argues that the ability to file electronically will reduce his costs of litigation. He seeks permission to register for purposes of electronic filing in this case only.

3. It is this Court's policy to allow only licensed attorneys to register as CM/ECF users. Because Mr. Neeley is not a licensed attorney, the Court will deny the motion.
