ORDER

- 2. On November 29, 2012, Microsoft Corporation and Google, Inc. filed separate motions to dismiss (documents #14 and #16).
- 3. In the present motion, Mr. Neeley states his intention to file certain exhibits with his responses to those motions and seeks the permission of the Court to file the exhibits as sealed documents. He contends that the exhibits contain "highly offensive images and images marked as 'Not Safe for Work' (NSFW) that return in searches by each corporate Defendant as was plead in the

Amended Complaint." He further contends that the images have the

possibility of offending the privacy of another individual besides

himself.

4. In order to determine whether these materials should be

placed under seal, the Court must review the proposed exhibits in

camera. Mr. Neeley is directed to submit the proposed exhibits to

the undersigned's chambers, at 35 E. Mountain Street, Room 559,

Fayetteville, Arkansas 72701, within five days from the date of

this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Mr. Neeley's Motion for Leave to

File Sealed Exhibits Supporting Objections to Dockets (14, 16)

(document #19) is taken under advisement. Mr. Neeley is directed

to submit the proposed exhibits for review in camera within five

days from the date of this Order.
