O R D E R

Now on this 22nd day of February 2013, comes on for consideration plaintiff's request to file a motion for reconsideration. The Court, being well and sufficiently advised, finds and orders as follows:

1. On February 15, 2013, the Court entered an Order (document #58) dismissing this matter and enjoining plaintiff Curtis Neeley from filing any further motions, pleadings, or pro se complaints related to events previously litigated without first obtaining the Court's permission.

2. On February 19, 2013, Mr. Neeley sought to file a document titled "Motion for Reconsideration of Docket #58 Rulings." The Court has reviewed the proposed motion and finds that it consists entirely of arguments already made by Mr. Neeley and dismissed by the Court as frivolous.

3. Because Mr. Neeley's motion presents no meritorious arguments, permission to file the motion will be denied.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that Mr. Neeley's proposed "Motion

for Reconsideration of Docket #58 Rulings" is hereby stricken, and permission to file the motion is **denied**.
